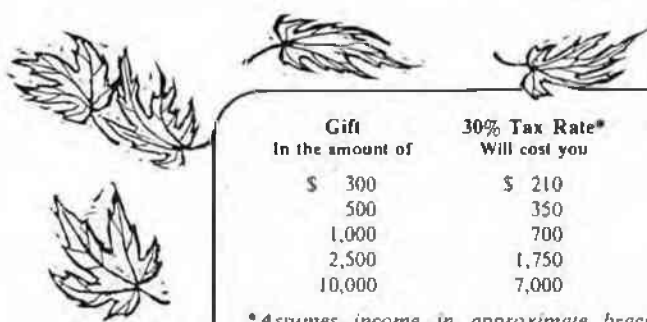

Pralle, Senior Vice President of the Fidelity Bank, was host to ten attorneys for lunch at the Whitehall Club; attending were Burck Bailey, E. Norton Burbage, Paul Dudman, C. Don Ellison, Allen D. Evans, Morris Hatley, Herbert F. Hewitt, Dudley Hyde, John E. Torbett, and Jon Trudgeon. C. Randolph Everest, Executive Vice President of the First National Bank, will host a similar luncheon at the Beacon Club on September 27.

Such small gatherings of attorneys whose practices include estate planning are excellent opportunities to informally discuss the work of the Community Foundation. The appreciation of the Board of Trustees is extended to the cooperating banks who believe in our work enough to tell others about it.

OMNIPLEX membership drive begins in September. The Science and Arts Center moved to its new location last February, and houses a space capsule, the Enchanted Tree, Gravitrax II, Kirkpatrick Planetarium, and scores of other exciting exhibits. The Charles Stuarts, J. B. Saunders, Jack Abernathys, Oklahoma Natural Gas, and Max Knotts have contributed to the OMNIPLEX Endowment Fund. The 1977 grant funded the Trading Post, where old time bartering is applied to today's ideas.



WHAT'S HAPPENING

Speck Homes has used their 1977 grant to build fire escapes for Junior Hospitality Hall, Rotary Hall, and Speck Hall.

Foundation President John E. Kirkpatrick was invited to Harvard Business School as a panelist this summer. Mr. Kirkpatrick and Treasurer Eleanor J. Maurer attended the Conference of Southwest Foundations in Colorado Springs in October.

The Community Foundation has received contributions totalling one-half million dollars during the first half of 1978.

World Neighbors is hosting a luncheon at the Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club Sunday, October 15, for Community Foundation trustees and donors. A new film funded by their 1977 grant about the World Neighbors program in Guatemala will be shown.

Ballet Oklahoma used their 1977 grant to help defray the cost of new sets and costumes for the world premiere of "Celebrations" on May 12.

Director Nancy Berry has been appointed to the Council on Foundations' 15-member Advisory Board on Community Foundations, which will meet in New Orleans October 24-25.

Deaconess Hospital used their grant to purchase a new IVAC Rater Controller and Stand for safer intravenous infusions.

Trustee John Kilpatrick, Jr., was a panelist at the American Council for the Arts Conference in Detroit in June.
