


## Thank You, Oklahoma City!

Data Update Total 1979 distribution was \$243,000. Assets at printing are \$7,665,373. The number of individual funds has grown to 243. The total number of donors has reached 1,086. Operating budget remains at 1.2% of assets.

Contributions small as well as large have made possible financial support of innumerable established community-serving agencies as well as seed money for pilot efforts of new organizations to meet evolving needs. OCCF continues to monitor and support such efforts on an ongoing basis.

Donor's Dinner This annual celebration of the OCCF donor community is scheduled for Wednesday, January 28, 1981 at the Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club. We are pleased to announce that Dolph Whitten will be our Master of Ceremonies. At that time, grants of income will be distributed for designated agencies.

OCCF — Partners in Leadership OKC For the second consecutive year we have provided financial support to this effort of the Junior League to enhance leadership capability within local community organizations. Our Director, Pat Potts, will be a panel participant.

Advisory luncheon with area leaders in the arts Former board president John Kilpatrick chaired a luncheon wherein staff and board were able to dialogue with several experts regarding current and future direction of the arts in Oklahoma City. This was part of an ongoing effort to utilize the special knowledge, experience and insight of leaders in each of the four major fields we serve, to enhance our responsible decision making.

# Mid-Year Grants Assist Oklahoma City In The Arts, Education, Health and Social Services

For the second consecutive year, OCCF has made grants for special projects in an effort to be more responsive to community needs. This year's grant recipients were:

Arts Council of Oklahoma City: \$2,000 to provide a constructive arts program to help alleviate the severe drug abuse problem among adolescents in the Willard Neighborhood.



Foundation for the Disabled: \$1,900 to underwrite part of the cost of summer programs in art, music and recreation.

Native American Center: \$1,000 to provide a summer program of education, culture and recreation for youth.



Neighborhood Services Organization Clinic: \$1,250 for medical and dental supplies for low-income patient care.

Oklahoma Association for Retarded Citizens: \$1,000 for camperships to help provide health and recreation experiences.

Pathways Child Development: \$1,350 for tuition for three children for bilingual summer preschool program.

Ntu Art Association of Oklahoma: \$1,000 for audio visual equipment for presentations to school and community groups.

Oklahoma Choral Association: \$2,000 for seed money for programs in youth choral development.

Oklahoma City Chamber Players: \$1,000 to partially fund summer performances of orchestral works.



Northeast Montessori School: \$1,250 for advanced Montessori materials for education of minority children.

Junior League of Oklahoma City: \$1,000 to cosponsor Leadership OKC, training for volunteer board and staff leadership.

Central Oklahoma Multi Media Association: \$500 to help launch an interfaith media project on Channel 25.

## New Board Policy Announced

A minimum of \$5,000 needed to establish a new designated fund was set during the October meeting of the board. Last year's match helped produce an increase from 75 to 96 agencies with this type of fund.

## Creative Giving

We are proud to be partners in some unique philanthropic endeavors. Examples in which we've shared this year include:

**Roger Givens Charitable Remainder Trust** — As provided by will, a very generous and farsighted donor has ensured that 1/6 of his annuity trust be allocated to OCCF to be directed toward meeting varying community needs.

**Kilpatrick Volunteer of the Year Award** — On the 18th of November, the second recipient of this prestigious award will be recognized as part of the Leadership OKC Seminar.

**F.M. Knight Grant for Handicapped Children** — We are able, with an annual grant exceeding \$6,000, to assist local caregivers in helping meet medical, recreation,

or educational needs of these special young people.

**Petree Gift of Stock for Education** — Mr. and Mrs. F.M. Petree, in an extraordinary gesture of philanthropy, have added \$575,550 in stock to the Oklahoma City University fund at OCCF. This gift makes OCU's fund, at \$1,139,752.88, the largest managed by OCCF.

**Kerr Youth Park** — Funds were managed by OCCF during the interim while tax exempt status was being secured.

**Billups, Arnn & Mascho** — This firm returned to OCCF one-half their fee for our audit this year, as a charitable contribution.

**An Anonymous Donor** — A gift of \$25,000 by an anonymous donor enabled us to purchase a Texaco property worth more than \$100,000.
